This course assists stakeholders in understanding their continuity roles and responsibilities, and provides them with the knowledge, skills and tools necessary to help develop and maintain a viable continuity plan for their organization. The course will cover continuity guidance and directives, program roles and responsibilities, essential functions, risk assessment, business process analysis, business impact analysis, mitigation options and key elements, and building a continuity plan.

All levels of government, private industry, nonprofit organizations, school administrators, emergency managers, and other community partners.

Course Objectives

By the end of the course, students will possess the ability to build a draft continuity plan and understand the key roles necessary for developing critical mitigation strategies and key elements of a continuity capability
